SB 577 Key Features



Bias Crime vs. Bias Incident: a criminal offense vs. a hostile expression of animus committed against a person or property, which is motivated in whole or in part, by the offenders' bias against another person's perceived race, color, religion, disability, national origin, sexual orientation, or gender identity.



Law enforcement's mandate: victims of bias incidents must be referred to qualifying local victim services or the Bias Response Hotline.




Hotline: statewide, victim-centered, trauma-informed, culturally responsive, support services.



Reporting requirements: Oregon DOJ, District Attorneys (DA), Oregon State Police (OSP), and Criminal Justice Commission (CJC).


Oregon's protected classes under SB 577

- o national origin


SB 577: Bias Incident vs. Hate Crime

- In many cases, hate speech and bias incidents perpetrated in certain environments constitute a Civil Rights Violation.


